WHO PAYS FOR SCOUTING

YOUTH MEMBERS

Assisted by their parent(s) youth in Scouting pay their share from personal savings and participation in unit money-earning projects such as the annual council coordinated popcorn sale. Members buy their own uniforms, handbooks, and personal equipment and pay their own camp fees for special events.

PACKS, TROOPS, CREWS, & POSTS

Monthly dues and funds from approved money earning projects such as the annual popcorn sale meet expenses for unit supplies and activities. These monies help pay for camping equipment, registration fees, Boy's Life magazine, and other special unit needs.

COMMUNITY - ORGANIZATIONS - COUNCIL

Each chartered organization using the Scouting program provides a meeting place, utilities and adult volunteer leadership.

SOUTHWEST FLORIDA COUNCIL

The primary financial support for the seven county council comes from the annual Friends of Scouting (FOS) campaign, special events/activities, annual popcorn sale, endowment income and some local participating united ways. These funds provide for service and program support to units, training of volunteer leaders, year-round operation of the Price Sanders Scout Reservation—Camp Miles and Camp Flying Eagle, membership recruitment, new unit organization and professional staff leadership in district program coordination. It also finances the services of the Council Volunteer Scout Service Center where volunteers can obtain literature, uniforms, insignia, advancement badges, and other vital unit and youth program support services including the maintaining of all records.

NATIONAL B.S.A. ORGANIZATION

Funds to support the national organization of the Boy Scouts of America come from local council service fees (1%), annual youth and adult membership registration fees, Scouting and Boy's Life magazine, contributions from individuals and foundations. The National B.S.A. provides the council with extensive program, camp development, volunteer and professional personnel support. In addition, the National B.S.A. oversees 4 national high adventure bases including Philmont Scout Ranch and the Florida Sea Base, national events and maintains communication with national organizations to support the Scouting program.
