

Wood Badge builds upon the best traditions and experiences of Scouting America and draws from a wide range of courses within and beyond the bounds of Scouting to present the latest in leadership theory and team development.

WHY TAKE WOOD BADGE?

By taking Wood Badge, Scouters will acquire valuable tools such as listening, communicating, conflict management, project planning and leading change. Participants will learn to understand and appreciate diversity and differences in our society. They will learn skills that will make them a better Scout leader. Units with trained leaders can deliver an improved program and a more meaningful experience for the youth Scouting serves. By attending Wood Badge, the participants will internalize the 5 themes of Wood Badge: Living the Values, Growing, Connecting, Guiding, Empowering.

WHO MAY ATTEND?

Wood Badge is designed to meet the advanced leadership needs of all Scouters, particularly unit level Scouters, such as Cub leaders, Scoutmasters and assistants, Venturing Crew Advisors, Committee Chairs and members. Additionally, Scouters serving at the district and council levels can achieve greater effectiveness through Wood Badge.

To attend a Wood Badge course, individuals must:

- 1. Be a registered member of Scouting America. (Youth 18 and older may attend as long as the appropriate S.A.F.E.guarding Youth Training guidelines are followed. They do not need to be registered in an adult leadership role.)
- 2. Have completed the basic training courses for their Scouting position. It is recommended that you have taken BALOO / IOLS training (depending on your position), as this will provide insight into the outdoor experience.
